A couple of folks decided to let me know what was lacking in their seminary training. I appreciate that as well.

A personal reflection. Although my current role in ministry is quite different than what I anticipated when I was a seminary student,

I can say with full conviction, that I use my seminary training every day. Whether it's humbling myself before the Lord and seeking wisdom in prayer, or theologically assessing strategic priorities in the budgeting process, or searching the Scriptures for insight into a particularly complex problem, or depending on relational skills to have those tough conversations every leader has to have from time to time—all of it springs from the foundation that I gained in seminary. All ministry activities and responsibilities are first and foremost theological tasks that must be grounded in and girded up by a strong hermeneutical foundation. Any other approach to ministry is barely Christian.

So keep those reflections coming. Let us know how you would answer the question, <u>"Why Seminary?</u>" My goal is collect as many as possible and begin using them to help prospective students gain a sense of the value of seminary.

Stay faithful, friends. The work of the Kingdom has no peer.

Dick Hart (M.Div., 1977)

Dick Hart retired in October 2013 after 28 years as director of the Program for Theological Education by Extension (PTEE). Last month PTEE leaders from around the Middle East came to Amman, Jordan to pay tribute to Dick and his work with the program. Under

his leadership, PTEE has grown from its one room office in a local church to the recent purchase of its own building in the city after years of renting office space. During that time PTEE expanded from a handful of classes in Jordan to classes having taken place also now in Iraq, Lebanon, Syria, Palestine, Sudan and Egypt, as well as among Arabic speakers in Australia, Canada, Sweden and the USA.



Lexi Ellis (M.A. Counseling, 2014) Lexi is the director at Hope Academy, Denver Street School. This is a program for adolescent girls (12-18) in the Metro Denver area who have been sexually exploited or trafficked. The program is essentially comprised of five major components: individualized education, counseling, vocational training, expressive arts, and health and wellness (therapeutic yoga,

dance, nutrition). It is still in the development phase and will open in the spring of 2015!

Alex Bricker (M.A. Leadership, 2013)

Alex and his wife Mary work with International Students, Inc. in Fort Collins, CO, working with international students at Colorado State University and Front Range Community College. For the past three summers, I have come to an oil and gas compound in a closed, Muslim kingdom in the Middle East to minister to the expatriate youth living here. It has been an amazing adventure and I have seen some unbelievable things and felt the hand of God on the ministry there.

Those summer experiences

enlightened my heart to the needs of expatriate kids. These kids are Americans, Brits, Kiwis, Aussies, and South Africans whose families have moved overseas for work and who desperately need the love and support of a youth minister. Expat youth as a group represents an almost unreached people group in terms of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Because they grow up in the global arena, many of them fall through the cracks of traditional ministry.

In January of 2015, Lord willing, I will be moving to Dusseldorf, Germany, to begin working with Youth For Christ to reach expat youth living in that city. I will be leading a chapter of a ministry called YouthCompass specifically targeting the teenagers of expatriates who work in the business sector of Dusseldorf. I covet prayers for this ministry and for the hearts of the students I will encounter. I also ask that people continue to pray with me for the hearts of the students I led while in the Middle East. This is a great adventure to seek and disciple international youth, and I am excited and confident in the provision of God.

Officially, I 'retired' in 2011 from 36 years of teaching theology and Christian formation. But as pastor Chuck Swindoll mentioned in a message at Denver Seminary, the committed Jesus follower never fully retires, only slows down. I have been teaching both a classroom and an online course

each year, along with leading a formation group each term which allows me to share the Word and life experience with keen disciples in training. I also teach seminars with folks experienced in ministry in Denver Seminary's D.Min. program.
